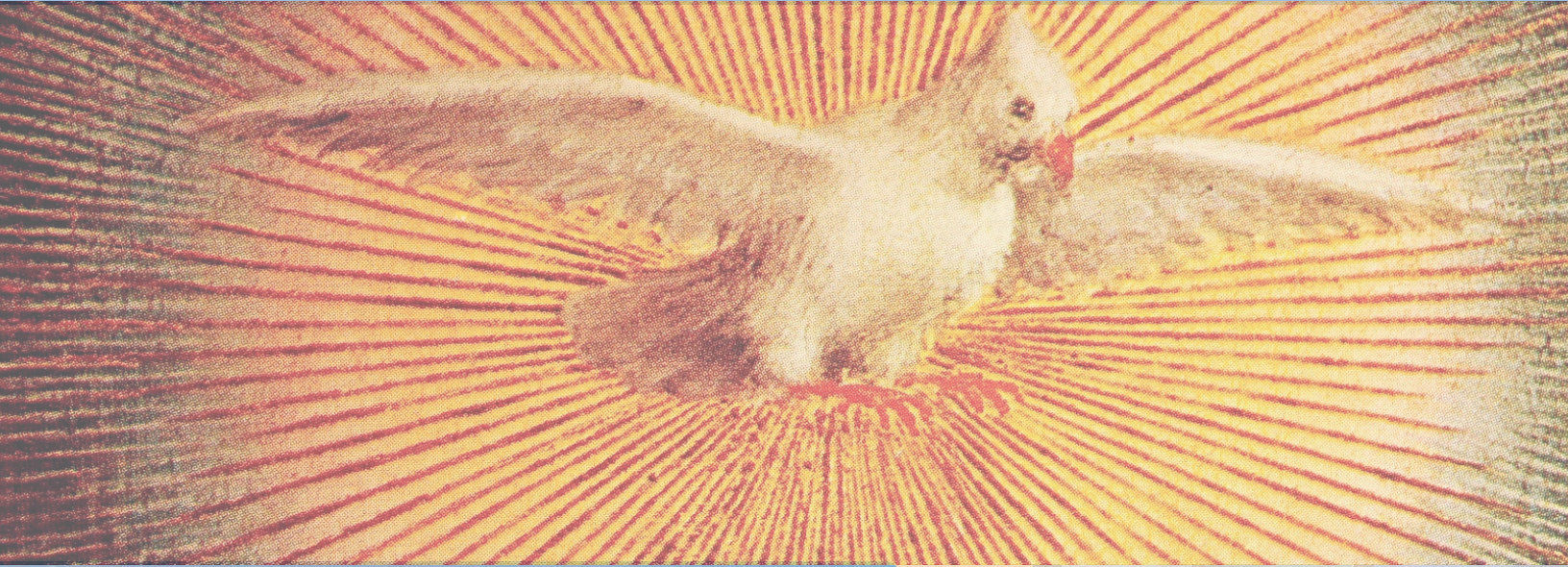

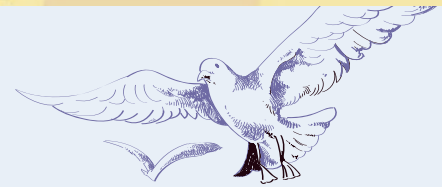

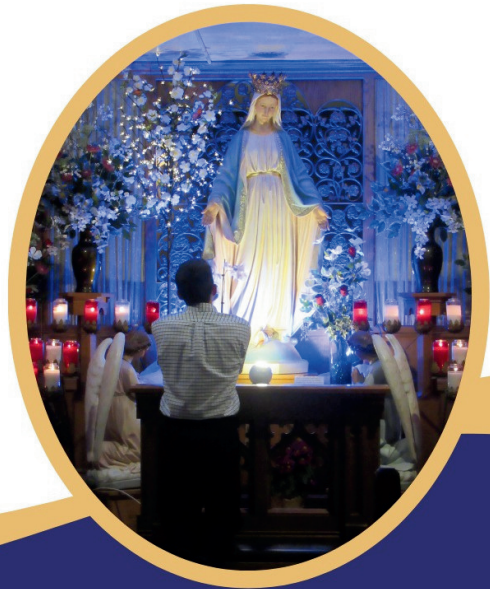

WITH FR. BILL SWICHTENBERG



The look of the Catholic Parish of 2025 has changed dramatically, I believe, from its look in the US in the 1950's and 1960's. Back in those days, the Catholic Parish was at the hub of the life of the city or town or village. In addition to worship, prayer, and faith formation for children and young people, which occurred in the school on the campus of the Catholic Parish (You were nearly shunned if your kids were not in the Catholic school), even the social life of the community was centered around the Parish. Commonplace were events like bingo, parish dances, summer picnics, sporting leagues and tournaments, fish fries, and even bowling. Saint Mary Parish, Oshkosh, operated three bowling lanes on its campus, as I recall from my days there as a deacon intern forty-three years ago.

There was a pretty clear sense, too, that the Parish was Father's domain, and, if there were Religious Sisters at the Parish, they were there to support Father. Father ruled the roost and any challenges

from the parishioners were quickly squelched. Parishioners were privileged to be members of Father's Parish, where they were expected only "to pray, pay, and obey."

The shifts that began to happen in the wake of Vatican Council II were church quaking, and maybe earth shaking. Before the hierarchical structure of the Church was highlighted, the Council defined the Church as the People of God in its Document on the Church, *Lumen Gentium*. As baptized believers, the People of God possess a sense of the faith (*sensus fidei*) that is inspired by the same Holy Spirit, who inspired the early church leaders and inspires today's Bishops.

Pope Francis has resurrected our experience of a Synodal Church. Baptized believers and Bishops walk together, *listening to each other with the ears of the heart (Saint Benedict)*, discerning how the Holy Spirit is guiding the Church in a specific time in history. The beauty of the Church's traditions, ever ancient and ever true, are reframed in a way that makes them relevant in our own time. I believe this falls within the domain of the Holy Spirit's job description.

The Church is irrelevant if it is not attuned to the signs of the times. This does not mean that its doctrine ebbs and flows with the whims of the culture but it does mean that the language the Church uses to teach may be in need of a bit of dusting off.

For example, I am wondering if our moral understanding of sin as venial and mortal could benefit from a different understanding of sin as measured on a spectrum from least serious to most serious. If I miss Mass on the weekend, committing, as some say, "a mortal sin", does that mean that my friendship with the Lord is dead (this is the meaning of "mortal"), until I receive sacramental absolution? No, your friendship with Jesus is not dead because you missed Mass but missing Mass is a serious matter that grievously saddens the Lord, who quickly forgives us, and encourages us to find a newfound discipline to do better with Sunday Mass attendance!

Pardon the digression!

The Parish of the twenty-first century, lived in the keys of Vatican Council II and Synodality, is to be a place where all are responsible for the mission and vision of the Church. There is a collaborative partnership between the People of God and the Parish's Senior Leadership Team, which includes the Pastor. The Pastor is a servant leader who listens well to the People as the People listen well to him. Discernment of the parish's path forward is the responsibility of every member. Every member has a charism, given uniquely by the Holy Spirit, and an apostolate or ministry or mission to make a difference for Jesus wherever he or she is. One and all are called to be Jesus' holy disciples, who then go forward to invite others to come to know, love, and serve Jesus.

Here at Saint Mary Parish, we are committed to raising up more and more members who live as the Lord's disciples, and who accept their responsibility to be a leaven for Jesus in their family, place of work, and even at the gym, as well as to be involved in leadership roles in the parish.

We rely on parish leaders who have a well-developed sense of the life of the parish. Our five pillars, which ground our parish's life, specifically worship, discipleship, fellowship, ministry, and mission, are enfolded in the life of the faith community by committees of interested and engaged parishioners who are led by facilitators who serve on the Pastoral Leadership Council.

With Nadine Duncan's expertise as the Director of Pastoral Administration, we have arrived at this moment in our history where the Pastoral Leadership Council welcomes new members who have already served on one of the committees centered around the five pillars. This formation on one of the pillars' committees is an excellent venue for raising up future leaders to the Pastoral Leadership Council. These new members come on board with an enthusiasm and a well-developed familiarity with the life of the Parish. This makes for a Council that is ready to discern how the Parish will move forward, guided by the Holy Spirit, to impact more powerfully the lives of our parish members and even others beyond our walls with the Good News of Jesus' Magnificent Love.

I believe that this strategy to renew leadership on the Parish Council is a good one. You will notice, then, that our process of holding open nominations and gathering names of those who might serve on the Council has been replaced by this new approach.

I am grateful to

- Kara Main, who has completed her term on the Parish Council, which stretched beyond a three-year commitment, and included her ministry as Chairperson.
- and Emily Jenks and Emily Lonergan for their leadership over the past three years.

I am grateful, too, for the enthusiastic Yes! to serve on the Pastoral Leadership Council from

- Matthew Budde, who has served on the Fellowship Committee and who has hosted, with his family, too many times to count, Sunday Coffee and Donuts,
- Dee Hurley, who has been involved with the Mission Committee,
- Teresa Kasdorf, who has been involved in the area of Ministry (Pastoral Care) and Beacon Ministry,
- and Tony Allard, who has been involved on the Worship Committee and sings in the Adult Choir. (Tony will be completing the term of a Council Member who had to step down. His is a two-year commitment while the others above will serve for three years.)

May the Synodal Model, which is charged by the Holy Spirit, the same Spirit that filled the hearts of the first disciples on that First Pentecost, continue to fuel our hope to be a Spiritual Family where we all are responsible for making Jesus and His Gospel the center of our lives and sharing that Good News with others!
