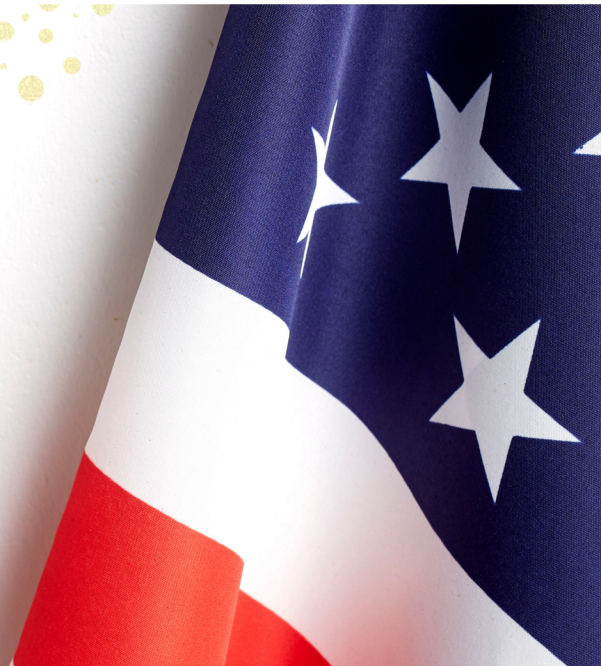

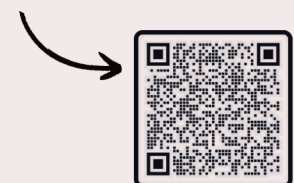

SCAN ME

in Joy & SORROW

WITH FR. BILL SWICHTENBERG
JUNE 22, 2025



Traditionally, the Church looks to the Sacred Heart of Jesus during the month of June. Before the month reaches the finish line, I thought I could share a meditation on the Heart of Jesus. This devotion, which is beloved of the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits), has its origins in the religious experiences of a French Visitation nun in the 17th century, Saint Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque.

Probably the most popular image of the Sacred Heart, however, is the gift of a vision of Saint Sister Faustina Kowalska (20th century), whose prayer was overwhelmed by the image of Divine Mercy, flowing from the Heart of Jesus, broken open and pouring upon us the graces of Baptism and the Holy Eucharist. Call to mind the blue beams of light, indicating the water, and the red beams, indicating the Lord's Precious Blood.

Pope Francis' final gift to the Church was his encyclical letter, *Dilexit nos* ("*He Loved Us*") *on the Human and Divine Love in the Heart of Jesus Christ* (October 2024).

Here is one thought from Pope Francis' Encyclical:

(Paragraph 16) The unique power of the heart helps us to understand why, when we grasp a reality with our heart, we know it better and more fully. This inevitably leads us to the love of which the heart is capable, for "the inmost core of reality is love". For Heidegger, as interpreted by one contemporary thinker, philosophy does not begin with a simple concept or certainty, but with a shock: "Thought must be provoked before it begins to work with concepts or while it works with them. Without deep emotion, thought cannot begin. The first mental image would thus be goose bumps. What first stirs one to think and question is deep emotion. Philosophy always takes place in a basic mood." That is where the heart comes in, since it "houses the states of mind and functions as a 'keeper of the state of mind'. The 'heart' listens in a non-metaphoric way to 'the silent voice' of being, allowing itself to be tempered and determined by it."

The core of prayer is this listening. Saint Cardinal John Henry Newman spoke often of *cor ad cor loquitur* (*heart speaks to Heart*), which he chose as his episcopal motto. The origin, though, of this beautiful notion of the intimacy which happens at the deepest level between the Lord and His Beloved Disciple (you or me) rests with Saint Francis de Sales.

Contemplative prayer is the prayer beyond words. It is a profound resting in the Lord. On the night of the Last Supper, recall the disciple John, seated next to the Lord, resting his heart near the Heart of Jesus. Perhaps, in Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament, you might find yourself simply setting everything aside, your Bible or Holy Rosary or Spiritual Reading, and relishing moments of just resting in the Lord, your heart beating in sync with the Lord's Heart.

This is how I best love to pray. To set the stage for this time of centering prayer, I offer this prayer to the Lord.

Source of all-Being, eternal Word, and Holy Spirit, Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier, alive at the center of my being, I wish to abandon myself with love into Your Hands. May my sacred words, which I will gently pray during this time of meditation, keep me lovingly attentive in Your presence and be a sign of my consent to the transforming power of Your Love and Spirit in my life. Hold on to me, Lord, or I will slip away from You. Do with me, Lord, what I so foolishly think I can do on my own. Let it be done to me, Lord, as You say. Here, I am, Lord. Here I am.

Note that your sacred word(s) is a mantra that you repeat over and over in your heart. It can be as simple as the word *love* or *peace* or *Maranatha* (*O Lord, come*). Ask the Holy Spirit to suggest a sacred word that will be special for you.

If this is a new way for you to pray, you might set aside five minutes in the morning and in the evening. As you become more comfortable with the silence and stillness, you might increase this to ten minutes. A typical sitting for centering prayer is twenty minutes.

Finally, I offer this beautiful prayer as a Morning Offering, which was first circulated on a vocation-promotion card published by the Maryland Province Jesuits.

Oh Jesus, I come before you at the beginning of the day.

I gaze at your face,

I look upon your side pierced by the lance.

Your wounded Heart speaks to me

of God's love poured out for us.

Take, Lord, and receive my heart:

the words of faith that I speak,

the works of justice I would do,

my joys and sufferings.

When I come to the Eucharistic table,

gather my offerings to your own

for the life of the world.

At the end of the day,

place me with Mary, your mother,

and for her sake take me to your Heart.

Amen.
