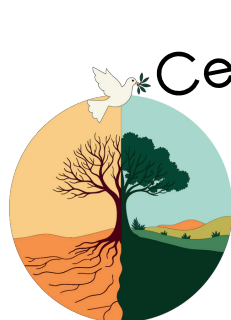

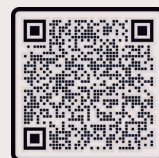

SCAN ME

in Joy & SORROW



As we conclude our celebration of the 165th anniversary of the founding of our Spiritual Family of Saint Mary Parish, we do so right in the middle of the Universal Church's celebration of a Jubilee Year of Hope. Both of these holy occasions occur as we celebrate the Feast of the Exultation of the Holy Cross this weekend, and the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, our Patronal Feast Day, on Monday.

In my Pastoral Letter for our Parish Jubilee, "Journeying Forward Together: Weaving Hope", I offered a meditation on the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary, beating in sync with each other, holding joys and sorrows together in an indomitable trust of God, their Father. After itemizing some of the joys so apparent in the lives of Jesus and Mary, I turned to their shared sorrows. I began by noting these words of Henry James, the expert on religious experience: "*Sorrow comes in great waves...but rolls over us, and though it may almost smother us, it leaves us. And we know that if it is strong, we are stronger, in as*

much as sorrow passes and we remain.”

As the Church in Rome celebrates a Jubilee of Consolation this weekend, the words of Pope Leo to the Participants in the Mariological Marian Congress on Saturday, August 5, caught my attention:

A Church with a Marian heart always better preserves and understands the hierarchy of truths of faith, integrating mind and heart, body and soul, universal and local, person and community, humanity and cosmos. It is a Church that does not shy away from asking herself, others and God uncomfortable questions – “how shall this be?” (Lk 1:34) – and to walk the demanding paths of faith and love – “Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be done to me according to your word” (Lk1:38).

A Marian pietas [dutifulness, affection, and loyalty] and practice oriented towards the service of hope and consolation frees us from fatalism, superficiality and fundamentalism; it takes all human realities seriously, starting with the least and the discarded; it contributes to giving voice and dignity to those who are sacrificed on the altars of ancient and new idols.

Let’s always remember that Mary has a heart broken open to her sons and daughters who suffer in any fashion. Be certain that Mary is not some meek, mild, wallflower-kind of-personality, submissive and silent.

No, today, she stands in the rubble of Gaza and Ukraine, and so many other war-town places, with tears streaming down her face, somehow trying beyond what can be imagined to lift up and strengthen her suffering children. Her sorrows are the sorrows of her children. When we are struggling in any way, she is right there to listen with her heart and to take our prayers to Her Son, our Lord Jesus.

As the Parish of Our Lady of Seven Dolours, we are grateful for the hope that Mary presents to us in both good and bad times, happy and sad times, and healthy and sick times. Her consolation and Jesus’ consolation towards us are one and the same!

Please take the time to explore this weekend’s fair in the Community Room and Marian Way as we embrace suggestions that will help us to grow in our love for the Lord Jesus, Mary, Our Lady of Sorrows, and one another! The current, which is holy time, is continuously moving us forward! Always remember that the Holy Spirit is fiercely adverse to moving backwards!
