TIE BLANKET TIME!



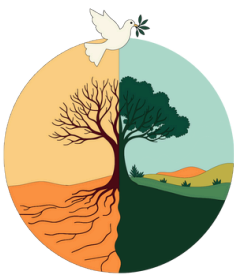

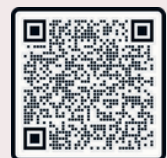

WITH FR. BILL SWICHTENBERG



Our Catholic faith is enriched by the graces which flow into our lives from our treasured Seven Sacraments. The Sacraments capture Jesus' deep desire to be with us always, especially in the ordinary and extraordinary moments of our lives.

New parents, remember that the Lord rejoices with you at the holy birth of your child. Baptism celebrates that the Divine Trinity is closer to your precious little one than you are. In Baptism, the divine brand is seared on the heart of that newborn; sin is washed away and the fire of divine love is set ablaze.

In the Eucharist, Jesus invites us to take our honored places at His banquet table, where the food and drink, so lavish, so juicy and rich, are His Precious Word and His Risen Body and Blood, really given for love of us.

In Reconciliation, Jesus reassures us that He is mercy incarnate and that no sin can stymie His desire to pour forgiveness upon us.

In the Sacrament of the Sick, Jesus draws near to us in difficult moments of vulnerability and fear, blessing us with His Healing, Strength, and Peace.

A newly-married couple, so filled with joyful love for each other, glowing in the grace of the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony, are reminded that their love is only a glimmer of Jesus' love for each of them.

And a deacon, priest, or bishop, never forgets the laying on of hands on the day of his ordination, as Jesus hands down the unique charisms of His Holy Spirit for servant leadership in His Church, to bring a Holy Order amidst the Holy People of God.

Now if you are paying close attention, you should have noticed that I missed one of the Sacraments. Which one? You got it!

So much more than a rite of maturity or passage or "graduation", Confirmation is a deepening of the gifts of the Holy Spirit received at Baptism.

As we celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation this Saturday, welcoming the young people of Saint Joseph Parish and Saint Paul Parish in Combined Locks, along with our young people of Saint Mary, along with Abbot Dane Radecki of Saint Norbert Abbey, we ask the Holy Spirit to take these good women and men under Her Wings, that they might always feel the Lord's tender closeness to them.

Like the other Sacraments, the moment of Confirmation on Saturday in Church is not a "one-and-done-deal." The grace of Confirmation is always unfolding in our lives. Your heart and my heart can always open wider to the gifts of the Holy Spirit! Those seven gifts are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear (reverence/awe) of the Lord (Isaiah 11:1-3). The Holy Spirit is never done with us! Hopefully these gifts will produce the fruits of the Holy Spirit in our lives. In his Letter to the Church of Galatia, Saint Paul lists the Spirit's fruits: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, faithfulness, gentleness, generosity, and self-control (5:22). At the end of each day, a review of the presence or absence of these fruits of the Spirit throughout my day may serve as a worthwhile examination of conscience.

In his homily last Sunday at Saint Anna Parish in Vatican City, Pope Leo said, "*No servant can serve two masters, therefore, you cannot serve God and wealth.* (Luke 16:13) [Who you will serve] is not a contingent choice, like so many others, nor an option that can be reviewed over time, depending on the situation. It is necessary to decide on a real lifestyle. It's about choosing where to put our heart, clarifying all we sincerely love, who we serve with dedication, and what our good really is."

Yes, Confirmation is about *choosing where to put your heart, clarifying all you sincerely love, who you serve with dedication, and what your good really is.*

With the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, I wrote this prayer on the occasion of this Fall's celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation. I named the prayer "My *Credo*". Note that the Latin *credo* is best translated as *I give my heart to*. Think about that when we pray the Apostles' Creed together at Mass!

Here is another Latin phrase for you: *lex orandi, lex credendi*, which might be translated as *the way we pray shapes the way we believe*. This Confirmation prayer is chock-full of beliefs that are integral to our Catholic Christian understanding of the Gospel of Jesus. In a politics-infused Christianity, which is practiced by too many in our nation, and is fake and a travesty against the integrity of Jesus, Gospel values are subordinated to one's perspectives, political and otherwise. What we need to uphold is a Christianity-infused perspective. Our faith permeates every aspect of our lives and should necessarily impact our political positions.

Here is the prayer:

LORD GOD, since the beginning of the human story, You have kept Your Promise, "I will be Your God and you will be My People, precious to Me!"

Even when I miss the mark and turn away from You, You keep Your Promise. You even became human in Jesus, Your Beloved Divine Son, to show me how I can remain faithful to You. Jesus lived close to others, always tender and compassionate.

With Jesus in my heart, I promise

- *to never doubt my sacred dignity, Your Precious Gift to me*
- *to trust always in my inestimable worth and value*
- *to see Jesus' dignity in every person in my life*
- *to always affirm the worth and value of every person by speaking and acting in holy ways that will encourage and strengthen him or her*
- *to believe that I am a better person when I stand with others on the side of what is right and just, good and true*
- *to love every person, just willing all that is best for him or her*
- *to speak out with courage when I witness another person being treated in a way that lessens her or his dignity*
- *to be a living witness to Jesus' closeness, tenderness and compassion, especially to persons who are pushed out as if they do not belong or are treated as if they are less than others*
- *to be a living tabernacle for Jesus, Your Son and my Friend. May His Light of Love always shine through me.*

All of this I promise You, LORD GOD. In the power of the Holy Spirit, help me to live these promises every day, all for You and Your Greater Glory. Amen.

May the Holy Spirit give our dear confirmands the courage to always stand up, in the Church and in the world, for Jesus and His values!
