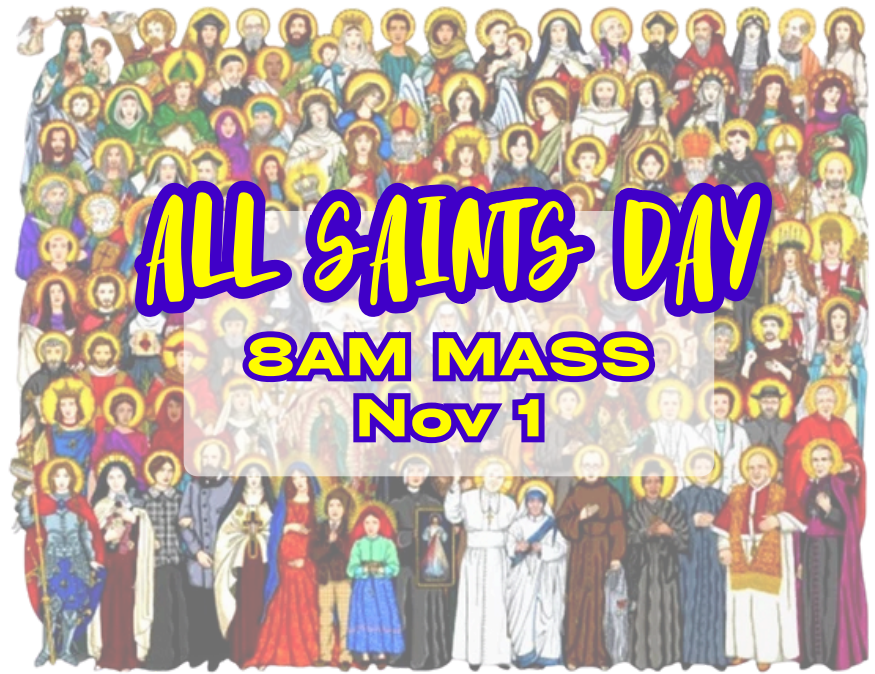

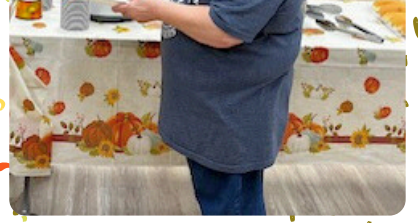


TRUNK or TREAT

- This week you will be receiving a giving update to let you know where you are to date. Let us know if you have any questions about it.

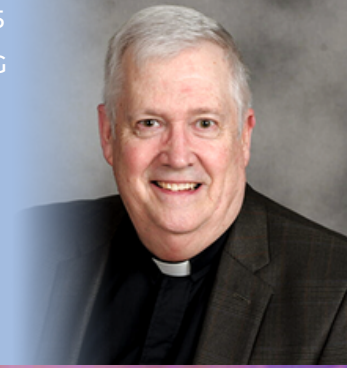

The Catholic Church dedicates the month of November to give tribute to our loved ones who have died. Appropriately the month begins with the Solemn Feast of All Saints on November 1 and the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls) on November 2.

Saint Paul named the first Christians of the Church the holy ones or saints. Certainly the halls of heaven are crowded with all the saints. These holy ones live in the presence of the Blessed Trinity, the Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier and of Mary, the Mother of the Church. On this earth, they were all at one time somebody's neighbors. Pope Francis reminded us that many of our next-door neighbors just possibly might be saints. These saints overwhelm those whom the Church, through the centuries, has officially raised to the rank of saint.

We are never closer to our loved ones who have died than when we gather around the Eucharistic Table on earth, praying with the communion of saints, who are gathered around the Heavenly Banquet Table. Our song of praise and thanks is magnified by the song of praise and thanks offered by the communion of saints, all in unison for the glory of God.

In November, let us pray for our loved ones who live forever in the brilliant light of the Risen Lord's magnificent love. Let us ask them often to bring our prayers to the Lord Jesus, especially for our loved ones who are struggling because of illness in body, mind or spirit. Let us ask our saints to petition the Lord to ease our grief and to mend our aching hearts.

Mary Oliver, one of my favorite poets, says this about grief in her poem, "Heavy."

*That time
I thought I could not
go any closer to grief
without dying
I went closer,
and I did not die.
Surely God
had his hand in this,
as well as friends.
Still, I was bent,
and my laughter,
as the poet said,
was nowhere to be found.
Then said my friend Daniel
(brave even among lions),
"It is not the weight you carry
but how you carry it—
books, bricks, grief—
it's all in the way*

*you embrace it, balance it, carry it
when you cannot, and would not,
put it down."
So I went practicing.
Have you noticed?
Have you heard
the laughter
that comes, now and again,
out of my startled mouth?
How I linger
to admire, admire, admire
the things of this world
that are kind, and maybe
also troubled—
roses in the wind,
The sea geese on the steep waves,
a love
to which there is no reply?*

As members of our spiritual family of Saint Mary place candles in our sanctuary in memory of their loved ones who have died, we might pray,

Dearest beloved [who has died],

I seem to feel the need of going beyond the images and pictures I have of you. God assures me that you live, and you still can show that love which I need and so ardently desire from you. I feel now freed by the purifying grief and struggles endured after your death to turn to God and in God, I find you.

How real is this experience and yet how difficult it is to share with others! In quiet moments, I lift myself to God in total surrender and love. It is then that you, my dearest beloved, become so very real to me. Again, it isn't a picture of you as I and the family always knew you. You are the ray and God is the sun. You come to me as light and I become a part of your light. And our lighted beings dance in the brilliant splendor of God's light.

I know you live, my dearest beloved! And I know we will never be separated from each other as long as we meet in and through the message of God's love for us, Jesus Christ. Your death has taught me that only death can free us to love each other in God.

God's life is our life. God's eternal love is shared and experienced in our true love for each other. Oh Divine Fire, burn and transform our love for each other into brilliant light and heat that drive out ignorance and the coldness of self-centeredness from both of us so that all barriers will truly fall and we will discover each other in God who is all in all. Then we will know for the first time that God is love and "there is only Christ Jesus: He is everything and He is in everything." (from Father George Maloney's Death, Where is Your Sting?)

Eternal rest grant unto them, O LORD,
and let perpetual light shine upon them.
May the souls of all the faithful departed,
through the mercy of God, rest in peace.
Amen.
