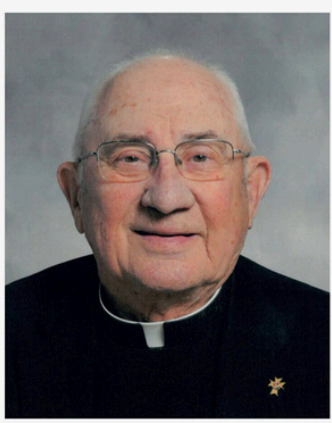

The Season of Advent invites us to be more attentive to the promptings of the Lord in our lives. While we celebrate Jesus' Birth into History and anticipate his Second Coming in Majesty, Jesus is coming Now in Mystery into our lives every day. Do you recognize Him and do hear Him?

Early Monday morning at 6:45, I was in the waiting room for Outpatient Testing at Saint Elizabeth Hospital. I was early, had completed the registration profile online, so simply checked in, and sat down. There were a couple of other people in the waiting room. I automatically reached for my smartphone, observing that the others were already intently scrolling away. I paused.

Behold!

I deliberately set aside my phone, deciding to spend the time in the quiet and stillness of centering prayer. While anxious about the test and knowing that my anxiety would ratchet up waiting for the results, I simply rested in the Lord. Time stopped for me and, finally, I noticed that it was 7:30 am. My procedure was scheduled for 7:15. I confess I then checked with the receptionist to make sure that they had not forgotten about me! All was well! All will be well!

A holy moment that changed the trajectory of human history was Mary's experience of the Lord God calling her to become the Mother of God. Perhaps she was taking a breather in her hectic day, sitting on the edge of her bed, just beholding. It was then that Mary experienced the Lord's marvelous love for her and His unequivocal affirmation of her goodness in the moment. Trusting completely, not knowing the details that would be put in motion in her young life, Mary declared, "Let it be done to me as you say!"

I believe that Advent invites us to ponder the Annunciations of the Lord in our own lives. Jesus is always standing at the door of your heart and my heart, gently knocking, waiting to hear your trusting response, "Come into my life today!"

Do you hear him knocking? Will you open the door of your heart today? On each of these Holy Days of Advent, can you hear what the Lord is saying to you? Will you experience Jesus's tenderness and closeness to you today?
