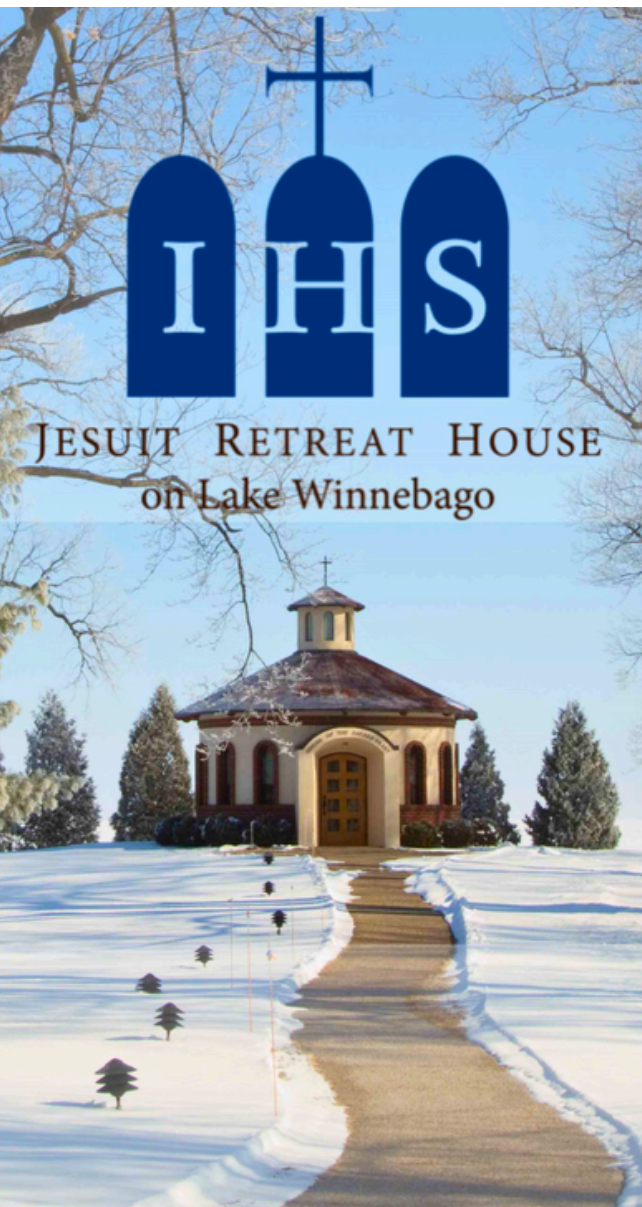

- Bishop Ricken has opened the inquiry phase in the cause of the beatification and canonization of the Servant of God, Adele Brice, the visionary to whom the Blessed Mother appeared in Champion, WI in 1859. Our Lady of Champion, the only approved apparition site of Mary in the US, is a place of pilgrimage for many who are touched by the grace of the Lord and His Mother. Easter Sunday, April 5
Pentecost Sunday, May 24
- I would encourage you to keep informed as to the ministry of Pope Leo. While his messages shared at the Angelus on Sundays or at his Audience and Catechesis on Wednesdays do not bear the same weight of authoritative papal teaching as an Encyclical or Apostolic Exhortation, it does us good to pray over and consider the words of Pope Leo. We sometimes may even choose to disagree, which is OK. But we are open to considering Leo's words. Pope Leo is the rightful successor to Saint Peter, and the Holy Spirit is at work powerfully in the Pope.

Here are his thoughts expressed Sunday, Jan 4, in his Angelus Address:

“It is with deep concern that I am following the developments in Venezuela. The good of the beloved Venezuelan people must prevail over every other consideration. This must lead to the overcoming of violence, and to the pursuit of paths of justice and peace, guaranteeing the sovereignty of the country, ensuring the rule of law enshrined in its Constitution, respecting the human and civil rights of each and every person, and working together to build a peaceful future of cooperation, stability and harmony, with special attention to the poorest who are suffering because of the difficult economic situation. I pray for all this, and I invite you to pray too, entrusting our prayer to the intercession of Our Lady of Coromoto, and to Saints José Gregorio Hernández and Carmen Rendiles.”

Let us pray, during this crisis, that the Holy Spirit would inspire a careful strategy on the US's role in the future of Venezuela for the sake of its good people.
