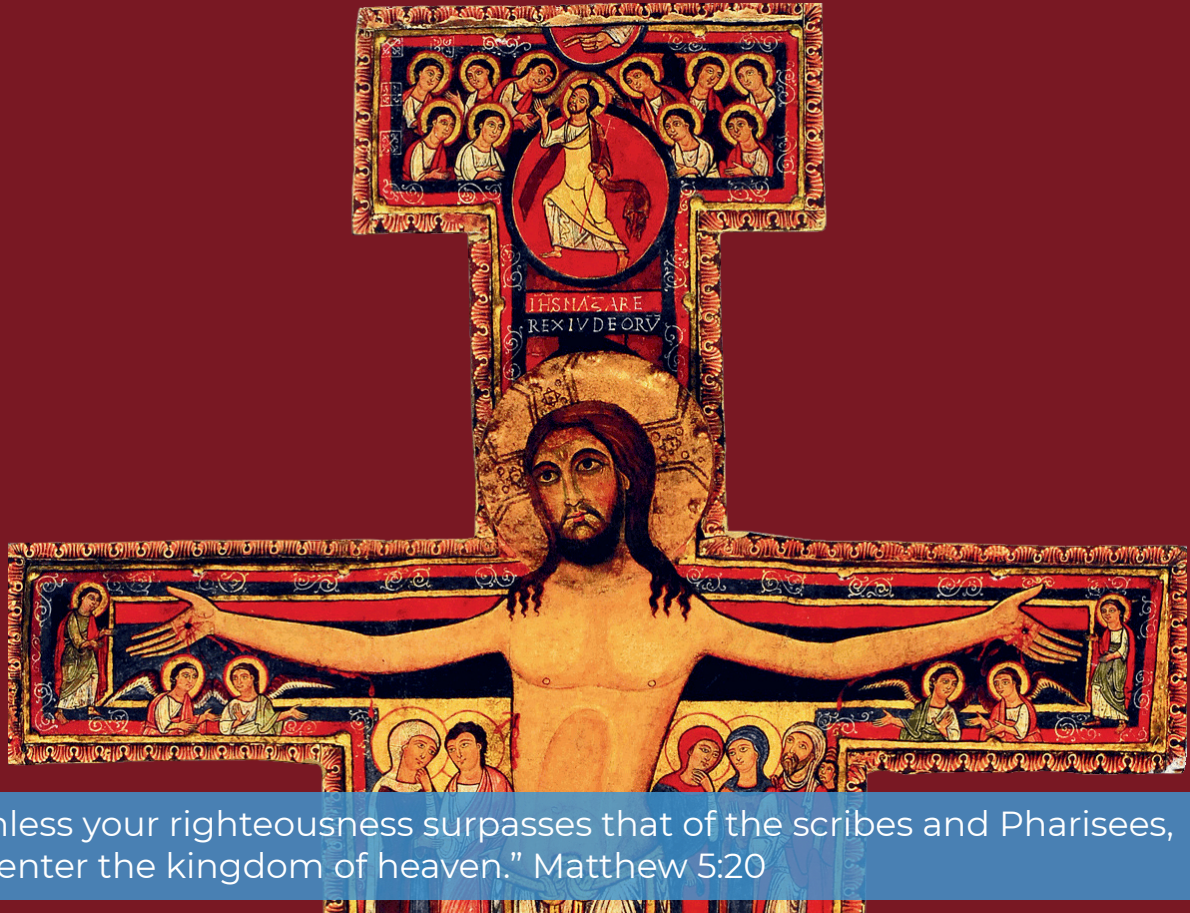

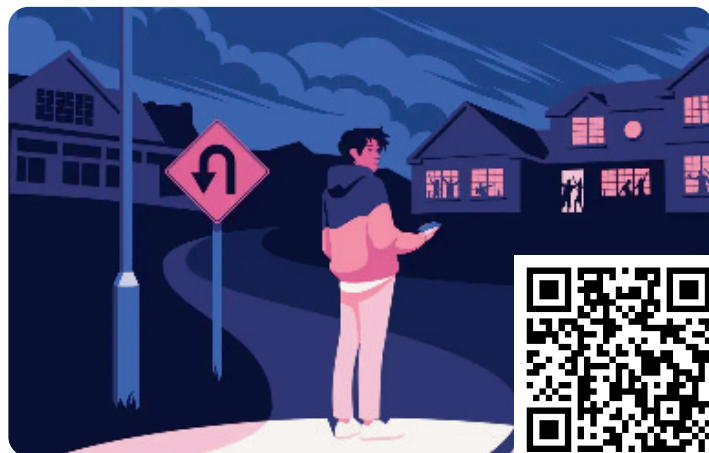

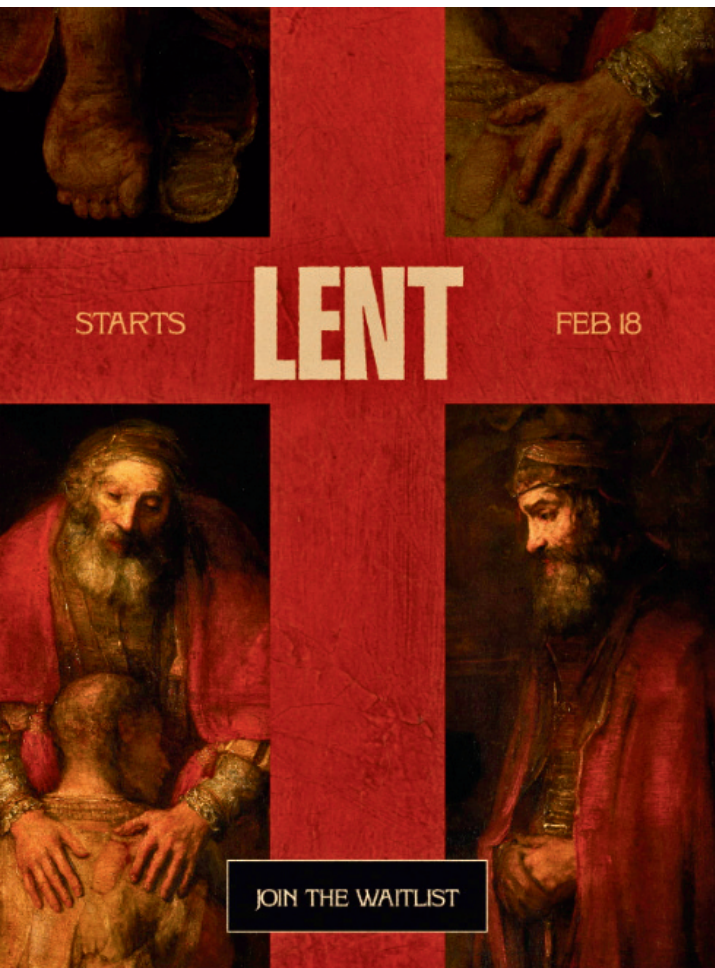
## Kids Lent: Miracle Hunters

# *in Joy &* **SORROW**

ST MARY PARISH - APPLETON // 2.15.2026

It seems not that long ago that we celebrated the Holy Seasons of Advent and Christmas. And now, just like that, we are ready to embark on the observance of the Holy Seasons of Lent and Easter, which occupies about 13 weeks of the Liturgical Calendar. We will begin our journey on Ash Wednesday, February 18.

Remember that Easter is a moveable feast whose date is determined by looking at the calendar and noting the date of the first full moon after the first day of Spring. The vernal equinox arrives on Friday, March 20. This year's first Full Moon during the season of Spring falls on Wednesday, April 1. This Full Moon is named the Pink Moon after the pink flowers that bloom in spring. Other names are Breaking Ice Moon, Budding Moon, Awakening Moon, Egg Moon, and Paschal Moon. Which name is your favorite? I like Budding Moon! Given all the above, Easter is on Sunday, April 5, which is about the earliest it can be.

The Easter Season then reaches towards the 50th day which marks the Solemnity of Pentecost and the end of the Easter Season. Pentecost Sunday is May 24.

Lent is not meant to be life or business as usual. It is the Church's annual retreat for the People of God which falls during the season of Spring. A retreat suggests that we give a little more attention to our spiritual life, namely our friendship with the Lord and our relationships with others.

As Google Maps sometimes announces that it is "rerouting," Lent is meant to be like a correction course. It is too easy sometimes to wander away from the Lord and to fall into a way of life that does not give Him all the praise and thanksgiving. Lent is a time for repentance, which means to be honest about our sinfulness, and even more, to change our hearts and minds again so that they align more closely with the heart and mind of Jesus.

The danger is that sometimes we like to rewrite the Gospel of Jesus so that it fits our own opinions and perspectives. *Metanoi*, which is the Greek for *repentance*, is more than cataloging our sins; it is turning our minds and hearts back to the Lord. It is placing our hearts into the Heart of Jesus. It is like the potter, throwing a clay pot at his or her wheel, sometimes starting over, making sure the whole surface is smoothed of any rough spots and fits with the artist's image of the perfect pot — or cup or vase. Lent is a time, then, to sit ourselves before the Lord, at His potter's wheel, with His Hands reshaping our lives, gently and firmly.

Our theme, which will introduce our homilies at Mass during Lent, is "By Your Holy Cross, You set us free." I debated between this and "By Your Holy Cross, You have set us free." Our freedom from sin is truly complete, it is a done deal, if you will, because of Jesus' victory over sin and death gained upon the Tree of the Cross. Yet, there is a sense that freedom is not a done deal and Jesus continues throughout our lifetime to set us free again and again. Like Son, like His Mother Mary, Jesus unties the knots in our lives that constrict our spirits. Like Jesus, like Mary, Jesus is the *untier of knots*.

What are the knots in your life that seem so impossible to untie? Lent is a good time to discern those areas that keep you from being free. Ask the Lord to help you with all of this! We plead, "Jesus, untie me! Set me free!"

Jesus' help is always available. The wrench in the spiritual life is that we are too often unavailable to the Lord.

Lent is a time to make myself and yourself available to the Lord through our practice of the disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving (works of charity). What will you and I say “Yes” to and say “No” to during the season of Lent?

Prayer deepens our intimacy with the Lord and connects us more closely with the People of God! Fasting gives us a heart more attuned to the sufferings of our sisters and brothers, as they hunger for food, justice, peace, respect, sensitivity, and understanding! Works of charity express our commitment to being good stewards, sharing our God-given gifts of time, talent, and treasure for the good of all!

Let me conclude with two brief meditations for Ash Wednesday from our beloved Pope Francis.

*Today we bow our heads to receive ashes. At the end of Lent, we'll bow lower to wash the feet of our siblings. Lent is a descent both in words and toward others. It's about realizing that salvation is not an ascent to glory but a descent in love. (2021)*

*During this Lenten season, let us pray by looking at the Crucified Lord Jesus. Let us open our hearts to the touching tenderness of God, and in His wounds place our own wounds and those of our world. Let us not always be in a rush, but find the time to stand in silence before the Lord. (2022)*

Happy Forty Days of Lent!
