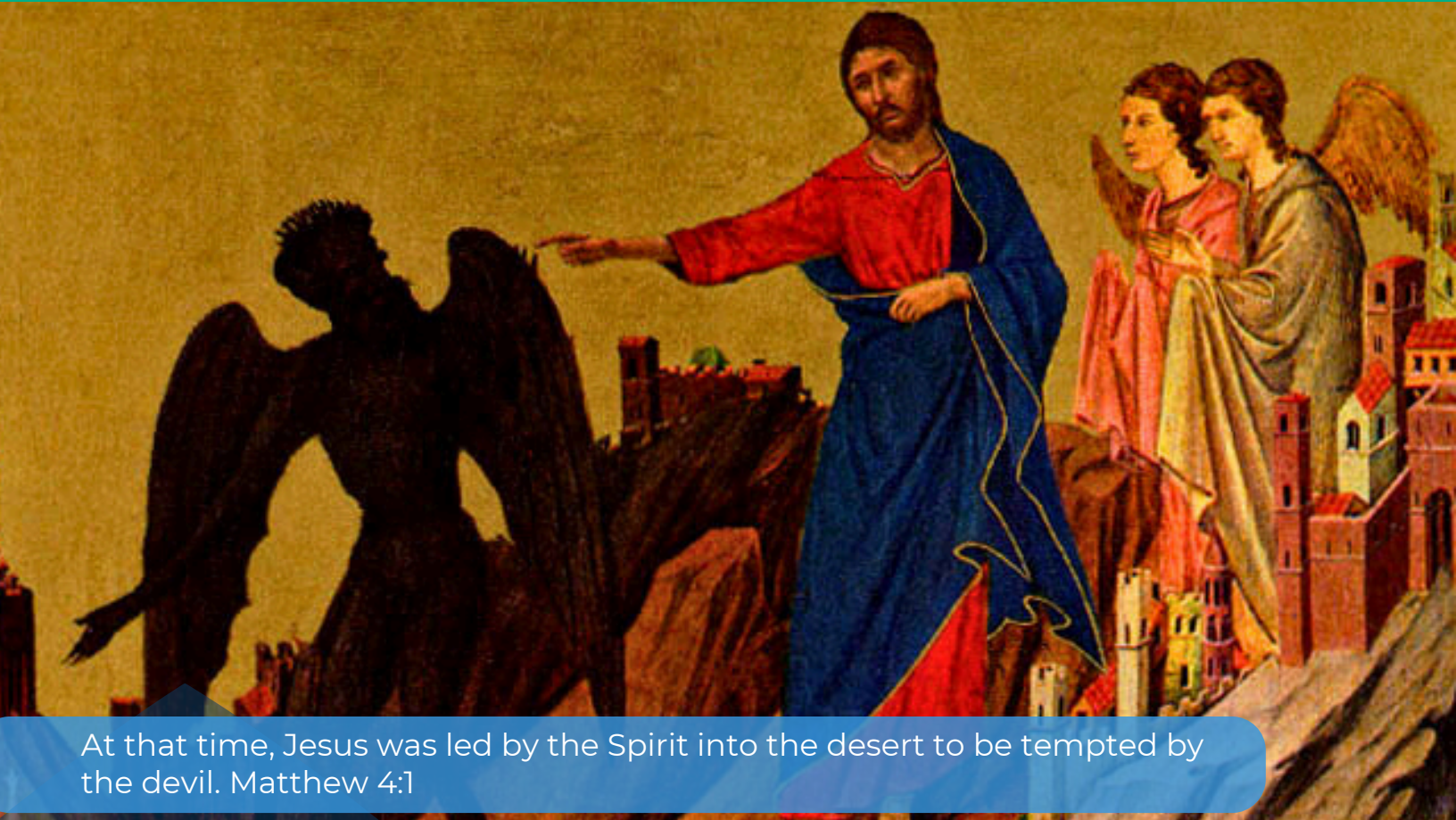

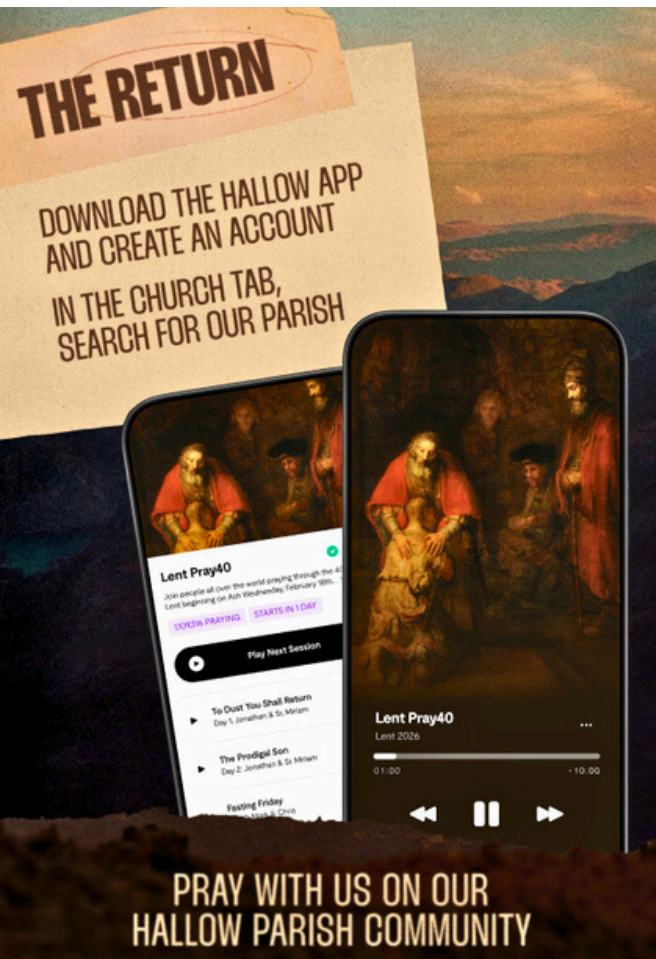
Kids Lent: Miracle Hunters

The Palm Sunday Path

Palm Sunday places before us a lasting contrast. Jesus enters Jerusalem not through force or spectacle, but in humility and mercy—exposing the limits of power built on fear and domination. Matthew tells us that when Jesus entered the city, the whole city was shaken. Not by an army, but by truth.

The Palm Sunday Path is anchored by the Matthew 25 values of feeding the hungry, healing the sick, and welcoming the stranger, and envisions actions of tens of thousands of Christians across multiple states on Palm Sunday afternoon.

In a spiritual experience recorded in Ezekiel 47:1-12, the Prophet Ezekiel visits the Temple in Jerusalem and is riveted by the gentle movement of water from the Temple's threshold on the south side near the altar. The water, moving away from the Temple, towards the Dead Sea, begins as just a trickle, becomes a shallow river, whose depth of water then becomes deeper and deeper as it nears the Sea. Walking in the water, wading at first, the water soon becomes ankle-deep, then knee-deep, and soon enough reaches one's waist.

The Anglican priest and poet, Rev Malcolm Guite, observes "Scripture is full of these baptismal images as we find water cleansing, healing, marking thresholds of exodus or entry from slavery into promised lands. Rivers flow to feed, waters gather to heal, to judge and renew, and to raise from their depths those who've been mired in darkness to be plunged into the un-blinding daylight of new creation. In the Psalms,

the deer pants for streams of water, and so do our darkling souls, but the water we thirst for, like the Samaritan woman in John 4, [who we will encounter on the Third Sunday of Lent] is the welling light of that beatific vision we ... are being beckoned toward: the Day-Spring, the shining face of Jesus.”

Our annual Lenten Retreat, which celebrates Spring Time in the Church, is baptismal in character. Along with those catechumens, the Elect, who are preparing to enter the Church, during the night of the Easter Vigil, through the waters of Baptism, sealed with the Chrism of Confirmation, and seated at the Lord’s Table of Communion for the first time, we are preparing to recall the sacred moment of our Baptism.

As we pray for our sisters and brothers who will become our newest members, we are preparing ourselves to renew our Baptismal Promises at Easter Time. Having been washed clean in the waters of Baptism, anointed with the Sacred Chrism, and refreshed with the touch of the Lord’s grace and healing, we begin anew to conform our lives to the life of our Lord. As His disciples, empowered by the Holy Spirit, we strive to feel, think, and act like Jesus. Easter reminds us that these promises are the organizing principles of our lives.

Do you reject Satan and all his empty promises?

I do!

I promise to identify those thoughts, words and actions in my life that contradict the thoughts, words, and actions of Jesus. Satan is the “divider.” So I will try to acknowledge my emptiness and confront the darkness of fear, indifference, close-mindedness, jealousy, envy, and anything else that preoccupies my heart and causes me to live a hypocritical life. Hypocrisy in me is the modus operandi of the Devil. Am I free from whatever so to be free for whatever? Am I free from anger, dishonesty, and selfishness? Am I free to love my neighbor without judgment and without measure?

Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth?

I do!

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified, died, and was buried, rose from the dead, and is now seated at the right hand of the Father?

I do!

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

I do!

I promise to give first place in my heart to the Father who creates me anew everyday in God's image and likeness. I promise to give first place in my heart to Jesus, who invites me to place my heart near His Heart, listening wholeheartedly to His Gospel so I can "walk the talk." I promise to trust that the same Holy Spirit that guided Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem and the Cross is close to me, inspiring me to stand on the side of all that is beautiful, true, good and just.

This is our faith. This is the faith of the Church. We are proud to profess it, through Christ our Lord. Let all say Amen!

This holy moment of the Renewal of our Baptismal Promises at the Vigil on Holy Saturday or at Mass on Easter Sunday morning is the reason for the Holy Season of Lent. May our hearts, refreshed and renewed, be eager to confess again that the Risen Jesus is the Lord of our lives!
