Join us this Good Friday for Tenebrae—Latin for “shadows” or “darkness”—a solemn and moving Holy Week service that commemorates the passion, death, and burial of Jesus. Through Scripture, prayer, and the gradual extinguishing of candles, we enter into Christ's suffering and the profound mystery of his sacrifice.



HOW THE PONTIFICAL GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION IS USED

What is the Pontifical Good Friday Collection?

It supports the people of the Holy Land and the pilgrims that visit.

At the request of the Holy Father, the Franciscans of the Holy Land promote the Pontifical Good Friday Collection in the United States and other parts of the world. Funds are distributed at the direction of the Vatican's Congregation for the Oriental Churches. A portion of the funds are directly allocated to the educational and ecclesial projects in the Middle East. The rest of the funds collected in the United States and a number of other countries support the ministries and programs entrusted by the Holy See to the Holy Land Franciscans. The Franciscans have served in the Holy Land for 800 years.

The Pontifical Good Friday Collection provides, Humanitarian, Liturgical, Pastoral, Archaeological, Charitable, Educational services, as well as care for the Holy Places.

- 65 sanctuaries and 23 parishes
- 6 guest houses for pilgrims
- 30 youth served by Bethlehem Boys' Home
- 63 apartments restored for families in need

- 700 refugees aided on the island of Rhodes
- 8,000+ Syrian families aided

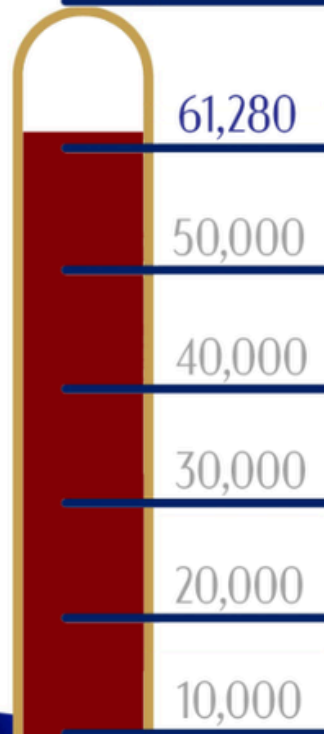

Holy is the week...

Holy, consecrated, belonging to God ...

Eat, drink, remember:

*On this night of nights, each one must ask,
as we dip our bread in the wine,
"Is it I?"*

*And on the darkest of days, each of us must stand
beneath the tree
and watch the dying
if we are to be there
when the stone is rolled away.*

*The only road to Easter morning
is through the unrelenting shadows of that Friday.*

*Only then will the alleluias be sung;
only then will the dancing begin.*

Here is a prayer I wrote for this Holy Week:

Dear Jesus, I arrive at the Holiest of Weeks once again, a year older, and hopefully, a bit more deeply in love with You. Still, it is too easy to observe this week as just business as usual. Remind me to pause for moments of silence and stillness on each of these Holy Days.

On Holy Thursday, You renew Your Promise to be with me always. The Eucharist celebrates God-with-us for all eternity! Deepen my love for You and Your Real Presence in the gift of the Mass. May the Mass be the heartbeat of my faith and the heartbeat of our Church and our World! Encourage me to see you really present in the gift of Your Most Precious Body and Blood. Bless me with the grace to see You, as well, in my brothers and sisters, especially in the least among us!

On Good Friday, You declare if I was the only human being to ever live on this little planet, Earth, You would still have died for love of me. Your Love for me is magnificent and marvelous. You love me even though I am still a sinner. Give me a compassionate heart that overflows with tears, seeing You still being crucified today, especially in my sisters and brothers whose lives are a living hell, trapped in war-torn countries, in detention centers, and in places where there is too much prejudice and hatred.

At Eastertime, may my renewal of the grace of my baptism be sincere. I do want to turn my back on all that contradicts Your Gospel of Love. I do want to be an icon of the Communion of Your love shared with Your Father and Holy Spirit. May my love for You and my neighbors be the only reason for my life! Remind me that darkness always yields to the fire of Your Spirit's Love, that hope never disappoints, and that cruelty and indifference never have the last word. Jesus, Risen from the Dead, You have the last words. "Do not be afraid! Whoever believes in me, even though you die, you will live forever!"
