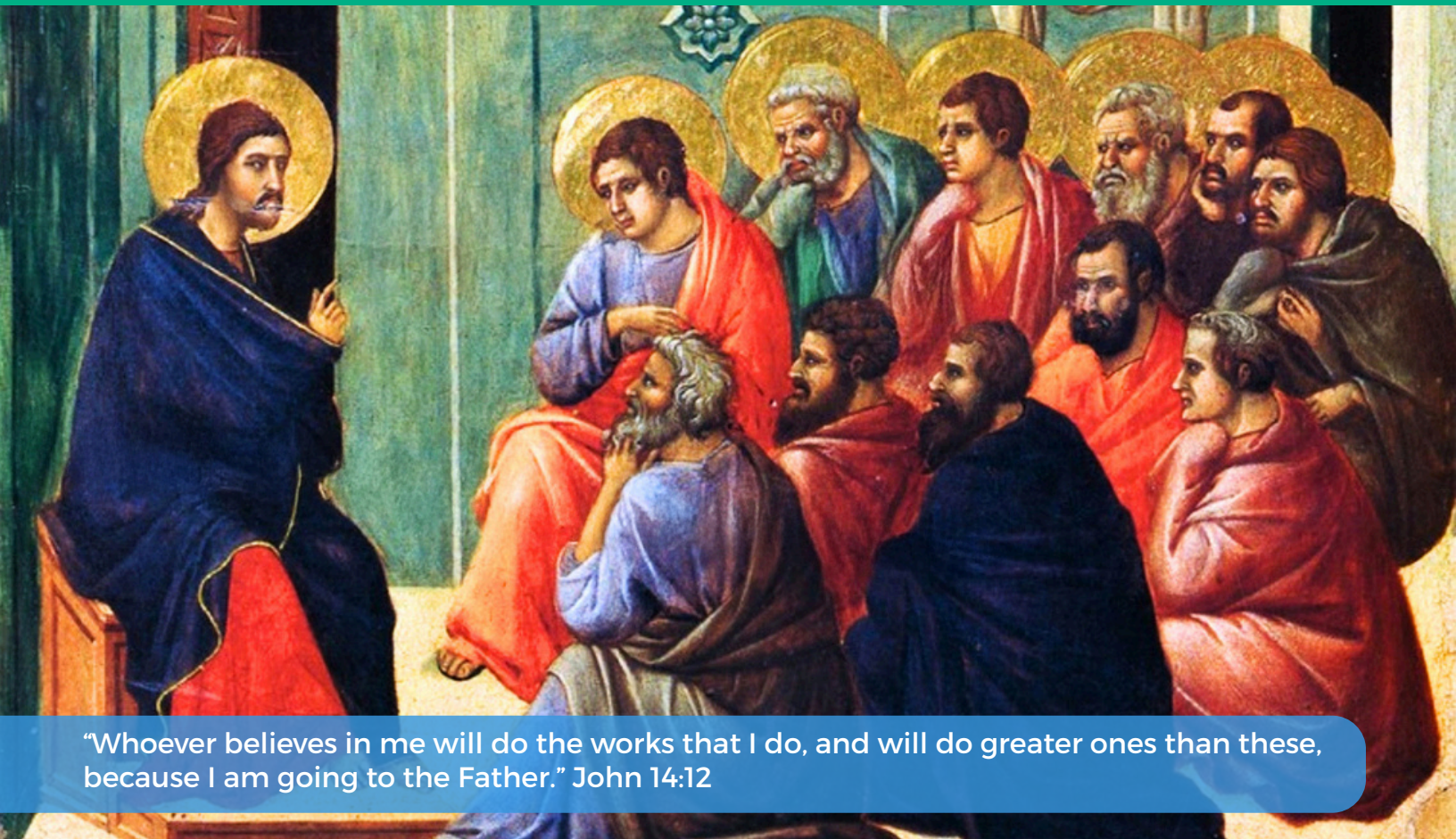

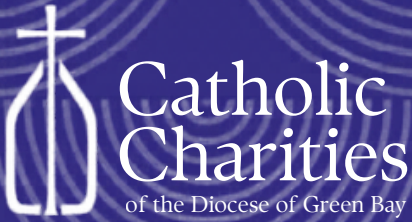

As we greet the month of May, I was reminded of this reflection from our own Bishop Robert Morneau's [There Is A Season](#):

"It is in May that billions of seeds journey into the darkness of the soil, that teachers and students begin their farewells, that parks are peopled, that trees cannot contain their joy and burst into verdant song, that the family dog has not seen for weeks, that mud and boy lose each other by merging, that tents become castles in the backyard, that mosquitoes break jail by the millions and in hordes vandalize every vein in sight, that blue books are filled with truths and stories (*You know about blue books, right? Back in the day, blue books were distributed and used in college course examinations - Fr Bill*), that the garage, now empty of wood, awaits an autumn meal, that despair attacks the heart of a candidate whose doctoral dissertation has been rejected, that the crack of a gun follows the *On your mark,...*, that the fields welcome back the housed-in farmer. *These have been some of my Mays — what about yours?*"

"It was in May that certain lessons and insights came home: that school bells ring two ways: a calling to and sending forth; that the loneliness of the long distance runner is real; that one waits to plant seeds until after Jack Frost has left the country; that every season and friendship has its romantic period; that a golf course is a microcosm of life;

that fears and tears are about the same reality; that lilies of the valley make a fine Mother's Day gift; that the bumblebee, despite its size, is to be carefully respected. *These have been some of my Mays — what about yours?"*

The Church turns to Mary, the Mother of God and a Woman of Quiet Strength, during May. We treasure Mary, in the center of the disciples, awaiting the descent of the Holy Spirit in the Upper Room at the time of Pentecost. We celebrate the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, on the Monday following the Solemnity of Pentecost. This memorial is a gift from Pope Francis, who added it to the Church's liturgical calendar in 2018.

Pope Leo would encourage us to look to Mary as a practitioner *par excellence* of the presence of God. See Mary in her home in Nazareth, caring for her husband and son, involved in the many household tasks of a wife and mother. She did all of these with a deep sense of God the Father's presence within and all around her. She took time to pause in prayer to ponder all her holy experiences. Whether in incredible joy or excruciating sorrow, Mary trusted in the Lord's closeness to her.

Outside of her home, at the peripheries, as Pope Francis would say, Mary stood tall with her lowly and marginalized sisters and brothers, reassuring them that the Lord would lift them up, while at the same time, pushing the powerful and unjust from their high pedestals. Mary never lost sight of this radical "turning of the tables" to protect the weakest against the law of the strongest, orchestrated by our merciful and just Lord God. Every night at Vespers (Evening Prayer), the Church sings with Mary about this revolution in her Magnificat, her Great Yes.

Echoing the prayer of Pope Leo XIV on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary at the Spanish Steps in Rome on Monday, Dec 8, 2025, we address Mary,

May the kingdom of God come, the newness you longed for so deeply and to which you opened yourself completely, as a child, as a young woman, and as mother of the nascent Church.

Inspire new insights in the Church that journeys in Rome and in the particular Churches which, in every context, gather up the joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of our contemporaries, especially the poor and all those who suffer.

May baptism continue to bring forth men and women, holy and immaculate, called to become living members of the Body of Christ, a Body that acts, consoles, reconciles, and transforms the earthly city in which the City of God is being prepared.

Intercede for us, Mary, grappling with changes that seem to find us unprepared and powerless.

Inspire dreams, visions, and courage, you who know better than anyone that nothing is impossible for God, and also that God does nothing alone.

Set us on our way, with the haste that once moved your steps toward your cousin Elizabeth, and with the trembling eagerness with which you became an exile and pilgrim, to be blessed, yes, but blessed among all women, first disciple of your Son, Mother of God-with-us.

Help us to be always a Church with and among the people, leaven in the dough of a humanity crying out for justice and hope.

Immaculate one, woman of infinite beauty, watch over this city, over this humanity. Point them to Jesus, lead them to Jesus, present them to Jesus.

Mother, Queen of Peace, pray for us.
